Family Worship at First Church

Starting on September 10th, each week we will have an incredible Family Worship experience called Route 252 at 10:30 a.m. in the Core. Route 252 is based on Luke 2:52, "Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man." We will strive to learn as families and teach our kids that 1) We need to make the wise choice, 2) I can trust God no matter what, and 3) I should treat others the way I want to be treated so that we too can grow in wisdom and stature with God. Each month the service will concentrate on a virtue such as Faith, Courage, or Conviction to name a few. Each month the service will concentrate on one aspect of that virtue with a different Bible lesson each week. During service, we will worship with contemporary, both familiar and new praise music, have skits, DVD portions, a brief sermon, prayer, and other aspects that will vary weekly. 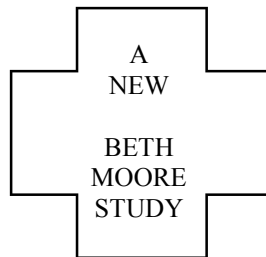
IT'S ONLY 7 WEEKS AWAY!

7TH GRADE CONFIRMATION


