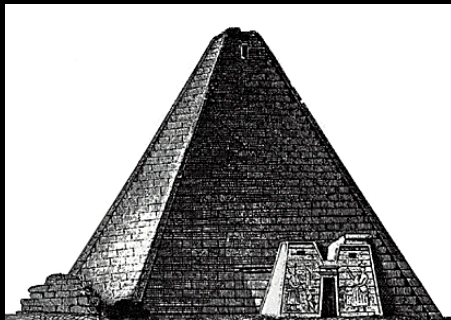

### **O** WHERE HAS THE SMALL GROUP MINISTRY GONE?

**R** It is present all around us. Whenever people come together in Jesus' name we have the opportunity for Christian community. The New Testament Church gathered frequently to study the scriptures, to pray, to break bread, and to fellowship. These disciplines built up the Body of Christ and in the power of the Holy Spirit they went out, in Jesus' name, sharing the good news of salvation available to those who would confess their faith in Jesus Christ and believe.

Presently we have many Community Life Groups (small groups) that follow after the example of the early church. Each group has a leader or co-leader who facilitates the development of community. Each of the leaders has a Community Life Leader (coach) to pray for, encourage and assist the leaders in any way possible. 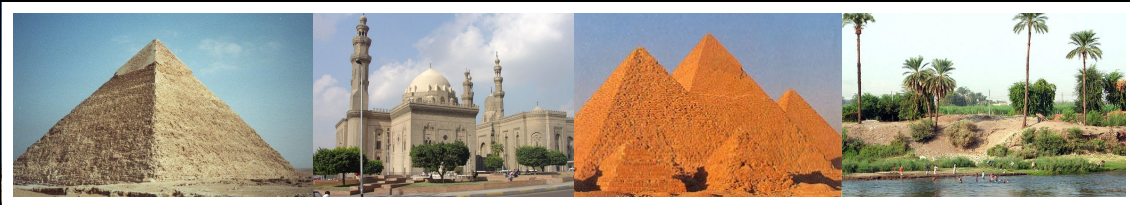


